Levels of Presentation:

Novice: Presentation is intended for a beginner audience.

Advanced: Presentation is intended for an experienced audience.

Accepted conference abstracts maybe published in either print or electronic format and indexed by Elsevier. By submitting an abstract you agree to this publication.

Guidelines for Submission:

1. Include title of abstract on the first line.
2. Specify the program track (1, 2, 3, or 4) on line 2.
3. Specify the level of presentation (novice or advanced) on line 3.
4. Specify if you are submitting a podium or poster presentation on line 4
5. List the presenting author first (first name, last name and credentials) on line 5 and all additional authors (please be sure to list all authors and submit bios for all authors).
6. List institution/agency/and contact information and email.
7. Skip two lines and type the abstract, single-spaced, using Times New Roman or Arial font size 12, with one-inch margins on all sides. The abstract is limited to one 8 ½ X 11 page (no exception) written in Microsoft Word.
8. Submit abstract as an email attachment no later than **November 1, 2010** to mcgoon@uthscsa.edu with completed biographical data and disclosure forms for all listed authors (download form: <http://nursing.uthscsa.edu/ce/INACSL.aspx>).
9. Confirmation of receipt of abstract will be sent to the first author via email.
10. Notice of acceptance of abstracts will be sent no later than **January 17, 2011**. Upon acceptance of your abstract, you will be sent detailed information about presentation time or poster set up time. All speakers and poster presenters must register.
11. The first author will be given a reduced conference registration fee upon acceptance of abstract (reduced rate is per person not per abstract).

Special Call: Submit a “Virtual Tour” of your skills/simulation lab.
