Patricia (Patty) Ravert has been a nurse educator for many years, first in a hospital setting as an education coordinator for staff development and since 1999 as a faculty member at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. In 2001, Patty began serving as the Nursing Learning Center and Clinical Simulation Laboratory Coordinator for the College of Nursing at Brigham Young University. As an early adopter of simulation in nursing, she began integrating high-fidelity simulation into the BYU curriculum in 2001. She also shares her vision of the role of simulation by consulting with other nursing schools on the use and integration of simulation. She was selected as one of nine national experts for the National League for Nursing/Laerdal Medical simulation project (Simulation Innovation Resource Center), authoring/co-authoring two online interactive courses for faculty development on use of simulation as an education strategy. To date, she has many publications and presented over 30 oral presentations and posters related to simulation, high-fidelity as well as low and mid-level simulation.

Dr. Ravert served as the BSN Representative on the Board of Directors for the International Association of Clinical Simulation and Learning (INACSL) from 2004-2008 and is currently serving as the Research Advisor to the Board.
